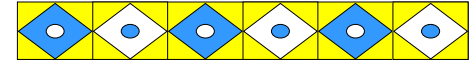
### Effective School Correlates

Throughout the year, other committees are needed. If none of the committees presented here are of interest to you but you would like to consider other committees when needed, please mark that option on the sign up sheet.

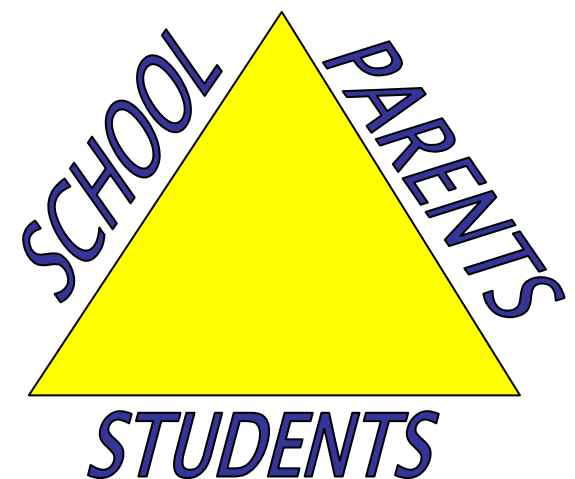

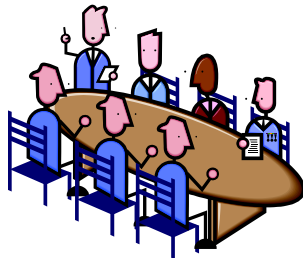
# Overview

There are numerous ways for parents to be involved at Fluvanna County High School.

This brochure summarizes some of the ways parents can get involved. There

are also opportunities that arise throughout the year. If you feel you would be an asset to one of the committees or are willing to help throughout the year as the need arises, please complete the attached sheet and return it to the high school. When the time arrives, you will be contacted by someone from the high school.

We understand that your time is valuable. Even though dates and times have not been set for some of the committees, we would like to invite you at that time, if you are interested.



## Principal's Advisory Committee

This committee, also known as PAC, meets once a month with Mr. Barlow and other administrators. The parents are able to voice their concerns about issues within the school. This time is also used for the administration to give information to the parents. They also work with administration to support the budget. The meetings for this committee normally begin at 6:00 p.m.

## School Safety Committee

This committee meets a few times each school year. A School Safety Audit is completed towards the end of the school year. This audit is designed to "assess the safety conditions in each school to (i) identify and if necessary, develop solutions for physical safety concerns, including building security issues, and (ii) identify and evaluate any patterns of student safety concerns occurring on school property or at school-sponsored events." The meetings for this committee begin at 3:45 p.m.

## Textbook Adoption Committee

Each year the school system adopts new textbooks for certain departments. The committee will review all of the state approved textbooks and determine which textbook our students will use in the following years.

## After Prom Party Committee

This committee will begin to meet in January/February. After the first organizational meeting, the parents will break into subcommittees. Parents are needed in order to plan the After Prom Party to allow a safe alternative to our students. Some of the subcommittees include fundraising, food, activities, and chaperones.

## Gifted Committee

This committee discusses issues specific to the education of gifted students. The committee reviews the implementation of services according to the local plan with a focus on identification, curriculum development, delivery of services, and professional development. They also discuss ways in which opportunities may be made available to students who are not identified as gifted but would benefit from enrichment services. The meetings are held at the School Board Office. They meet at least four times a year.

## School Calendar Committee

This committee will meet a few times in the spring to discuss and set the school calendar for the following school year. All Fluvanna schools will have representatives on the committee.
